**2010 YEAR END TOURNAMENT
BOYS U11 TAW PROGRAM**

**Sunday August 15, 2010
Clarke Park in Barrhaven (Standherd Drive and Cederview Road)**

Here are the details of the year end tournament:

- All teams will be scheduled to play three games in a round-robin format, weather permitting.
- Games are two 20-minute halves, with a 5 minute halftime break
- Please see the attached game schedule for your team. Game schedules and pool assignments will also be posted on the OSU website.
- All teams will have at least 20 minutes between games for change over
- To also assist in keeping on schedule, all players are asked to be at the field **at least 15 minutes** before their scheduled game time. As it can be confusing at a busy tournament, it is recommended that a team coach or delegate is at the field 20-25 minutes before the game so that players/parents arriving early know they are in the right place.
- Teams should be doing any warm-up they want while the preceding game is finishing. Don't wait until that game finishes as you will need the 15 minutes for the other teams to clear the sidelines and to get prepared to start the game on time.
- It is preferred that no one is set up to observe a game from the endline, but most certainly there shouldn't be anyone directly behind or near the goal. If set up behind the endline then people should be well back to reduce chance of injury.
- There will be no tie-breaking of round-robin games.
- A BBQ lunch will be provided free of charge for all players and 3 team volunteers. Parents, siblings and other spectators may purchase lunch after the players have picked up their food. Coupons can be purchased ahead of the lunch period.
- Team lunch schedules will also be provided on the website.
- Medals will be provided to all teams when they pick up their lunch coupons from the registration tent. There will be enough medals for all team members and limited volunteers, whether at the tournament or not. The medals are to be handed out by the coaches **after the final game**.
- We play with the same rules and same approach during our tournaments as we do during the season. This is a friendly competition. Equal playing time is still observed. Encouragement should be provided to all players, no matter what team they're on.
- Good sportsmanship should be demonstrated at ALL times by players and parents alike.
- The tournament will go ahead, rain or shine. Only severely high temperatures or thunder/lightning activity will put a halt to the games. However, remember that conditions change throughout the day so one game being cancelled does not mean the next game is.

- Check the weather forecast beforehand and come prepared. Depending on weather conditions and location, consider sun block, mosquito repellent, hats for when not playing, lots of water/drink.
- Don't forget lawn chairs.
- Please, please, pick up after your own kids and where required, help clean up any other garbage left by your team. Every year, for some reason, it is the volunteer coaches, managers and coordinators that can be found walking around picking up. They've done a ton already this season, please help out and keep our fields tidy.
- Check the website on Thursday or Friday before the tournament to ensure that all details have been finalized at which point you should double-check your game schedule in case there were last-minute changes.
- Be organized. Don't make other teams wait. Get your team ready and have your lineup prepared
- When your game is over and the handshake has been completed please immediately clear the field and sidelines so that the next teams can get set up.
- Arrange for someone on each team to bring a garbage bag. The garbage cans, if available, always get filled up quickly and become overflowing. Each team should take care of their own garbage, which includes having someone take the bag home with them. Leaving the garbage at the site will cause the club financial penalties and is not acceptable.
- Medals are participation medals for the season, and not only for those that participated in the tournament itself. If you have extra medals please return them with your equipment bag at the end of the season.
- IF you are going to be too shorthanded for the tournament you are allowed to make use of call ups from a lower age division.
